Soprano Amy Suznovich was the first recipient of the **Deborah Maher Award** from The Opera Project and received nominations for **Best Leading Actress** as Cunegonde in *Candide* and **Best Female Solo** for her performance of *Glitter and Be Gay*. She most recently appeared at the King's Theater in Brooklyn, televised live on October 6th, as the Cantor/Soloist with the Philharmonia Orchestra of New York and Magnificat Foundation. Other performances this season include Donna Anna in *Don Giovanni*, Konstanze in *Die Entfuhrung aus dem Serail* and Gilda in *Rigoletto*.

Last season she performed as Musetta in *La Boheme* and Gilda in *Verdi in Vermont* with the Southern Vermont Lyric Theatre, and Musetta with the Orchestra Society of Philadelphia, as well as Soprano Soloist for Saint-Saens *Christmas Oratorio* with the Kips Bay Chorale and Soprano Soloist for Handel's *Messiah* with Hunterdon Symphony.

She appeared as the Hungarian Opera Singer in *Our Town Now* at the George Street Playhouse, and originated the roles of Frenchie in *A Night in the Wilde Wild West* with the Baroque Orchestra of NJ, and Dr. Lipskom in *Sephro: Earth's Revenge* at the Philadelphia Fringe Festival. She has performed with organizations that include the Newtown Chamber Orchestra, the New Brunswick Chamber Orchestra, Queens Opera (NJ), Boheme Opera, trio@Play and Main Street Theatre, among others. Some of her signature roles include Musetta (*La Boheme*), Cunegonde (*Candide*), Lucia (*Lucia di Lammermoor*), Donna Anna (*Don Giovanni*) and Gilda (*Rigoletto*), as well as Orff's *Carmina Burana*, Handel's *Messiah*, and Saint-Saens' *Christmas Oratorio* in the concert repertoire.

She is often sought as a National Anthem/God Bless America Soloist for professional sports teams, such as the Philadelphia Phillies, Brooklyn Cyclones and the Boston Cannons. Ms. Suznovich is an alumni of the OperaWorks Winter Intensive and a magna cum laude graduate of Ithaca College.
